

Argonne signs MOU with C4UC



Argonne (UChicago Argonne, LLC) has signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with [The Center for Understanding Change](#) (C4UC), a private, not-for-profit, independent research center founded in 2011.

The MOU was signed to promote scientific and technological cooperation in the field of systems engineering, particularly as it relates to analysis of global change, global risk management and decision science.

C4UC uses dynamic world models and advanced analytical methods to explore ideas, actions, planned decisions and "what ifs," with a focus on engineering, operational and sustainable perspectives of complexity across disciplines. These complex systems are critical to understanding impacts of environmental, technological, economic and political events.

The collaboration between UChicago Argonne, LLC and C4UC aims to:

- combine the expertise from each organization to accomplish unique scientific goals;
- commonly develop and use specialized knowledge and facilities; and
- increase cooperation and mutual support among the organizations in general.

Renowned scientists and engineers from universities, government agencies, research institutes, and private industry collaborate with C4UC to reveal drivers that control the cascade of impacts triggered by political, economic or natural events.
